

Free distribution of food and other necessities to those affected by COVID-19

Tama City will distribute food packages containing rice, retort-pouch foods, snacks and other daily cities to households with children below university age and university students who live or attend school in the city and are in need. (These packages are provided on a first-come, first-served basis.)

■Please check your My COVID Record (proof of vaccination status)

If the pre-vaccination screening questionnaire and vaccination certificate you received with your vaccination voucher did not contain your My COVID Record (proof of vaccination status), please contact the Coronavirus Vaccination Call Center.

■Omicron-Specific Vaccines

The vaccination interval has been shortened so that vaccinations can be given 3 months after the previous $(2^{nd} - 4^{th})$ shot. Those who have already made appointments for vaccinations at a date more than 5 months after their previous shot can change their appointments via the Tama City Vaccine Appointment website or the Coronavirus Vaccination Call Center.

Note Note Vaccination vouchers for the omicron-specific vaccine were sent out on October 31 to residents who are 12 years or older and have already received 2-4 inoculations against the coronavirus between June 1 and Aug. 31, 2022. Residents over 60: The city will specify in advance the date and time of vaccination (having processed the reduced vaccination interval), the group vaccination center and the vaccine to be used (Pfizer's BA.4-5-specific vaccine). (The date and time are printed on the vaccination voucher, but can be changed. For details, please refer to the notice enclosed with your voucher.)

Residents aged between 12 and 59: Once you receive your vaccination voucher, you can make an appointment for a date at least 3 months since your last inoculation.

■1st and 2nd doses of the conventional vaccine and 1st to 3rd doses for children (aged 5-11)

Adults (aged 18-64) will receive a ¥1,000 discount and children (aged 3-17 and high-school students) and seniors (aged 65 and over) a ¥300 discount on the regular admission price, with free admission for children under 2. Special discount tickets are available on the city's official website and at the Tama Center Branch of City Hall, the Nagayama and Sekido Community Centers. Discounts are available for up to five people with one special discount ticket. Bookings should be made in advance and tickets purchased at the entrance to Sanrio Puroland. When purchasing tickets, present the special discount ticket and ID (for the ticket purchaser only; a driver's license, health insurance card, or other identification that proves the individual lives and/or works in Tama).
