[What is Dondoyaki?] It is a Japanese traditional event in mid-January called New Year's bonfire, where people bring such as their New Year's pine decorations, sacred straw ropes and the first calligraphy of the year; then, burned them together with the *yagura* and pray for good health and a bountiful harvest.
